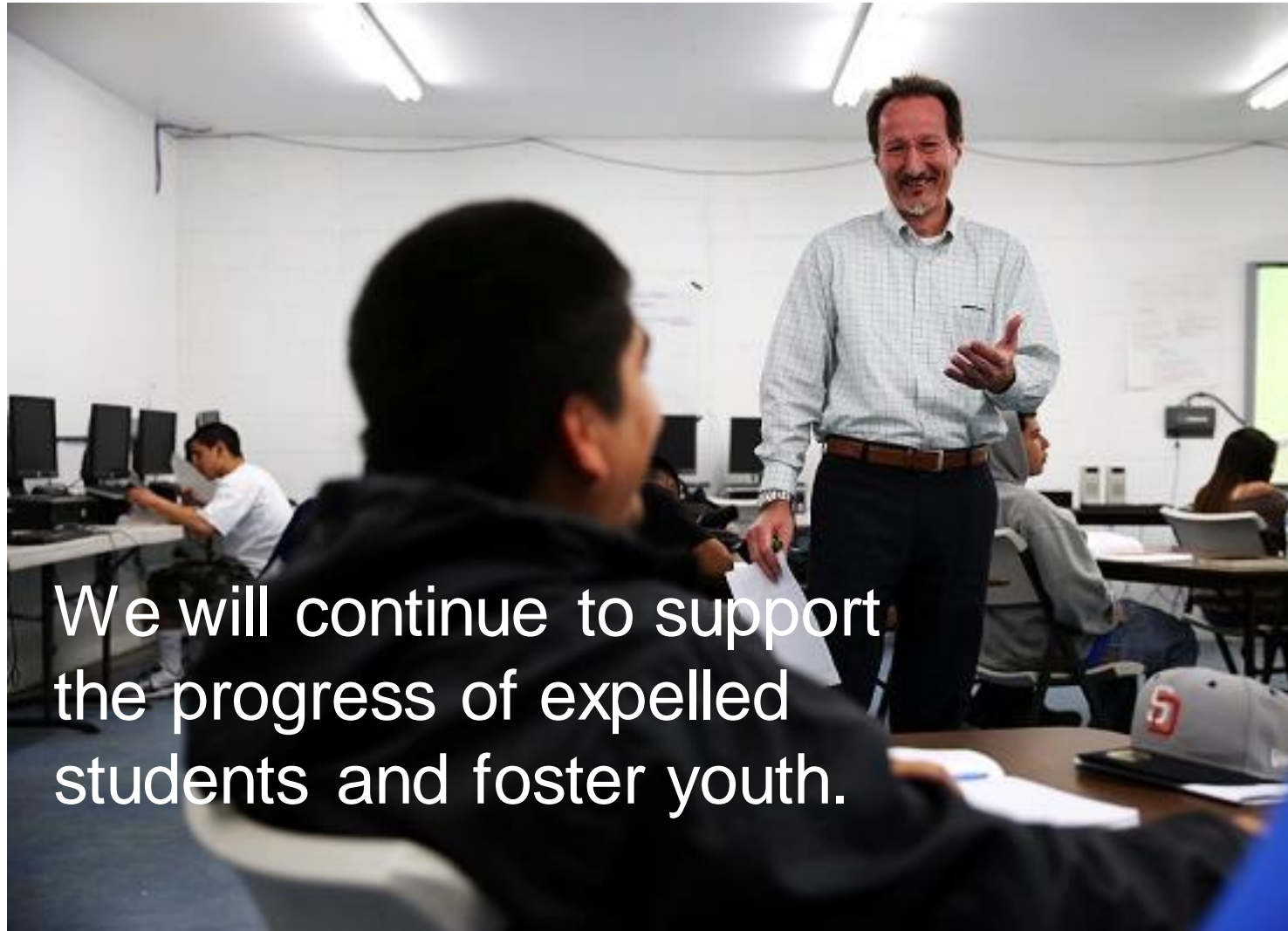
Parent excursions introduce parents and family members to different experiences and connect them to their student's learning.
