SAN DIEGO COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION SEEKS PUBLIC INPUT AS PART OF REDISTRICTING PROCESS

Every 10 years, local governments use new census data to redraw their district lines to reflect how local populations have changed.

You are invited to participate in the redistricting process for the County Board of Education by sharing how you think district boundaries should be drawn to best represent your community.

What is redistricting and why is it important?

Redistricting determines which neighborhoods and communities are grouped together into a district for purposes of electing a board member to the San Diego County Board of Education. The process and applicable criteria seek to empower communities by ensuring they are represented by political representatives of their choice.

How can I get involved?

On Oct. 13 at 6 p.m., the board will hold a public hearing to receive input on the draft plans for redistricting of the County Board of Education trustee areas based on the 2020 federal census data. This meeting will be conducted via [live stream webcast](#).

What happens next?

The following additional hearings will take place to solicit public input on draft maps and plans:
