The County Board of Education directs the County Superintendent of Schools to develop and maintain instructional plans which are in conformance with Education Code requirements and prepare students to become productive members of society.

Curriculum development is the responsibility of the certificated staff of the County Superintendent of Schools. To be consistent with the mission and goals of the San Diego County Office of Education, curriculum development will:

- Align to the current *State Curriculum Frameworks* and *Model Curriculum Standards* adopted by the State Board of Education.
- Provide challenging content and performance standards in all subject areas.
- Address the unique needs of students based on ongoing assessment.
- Promote high expectations for student achievement.
- Assist students in meeting requirements for high school graduation and prepare them for higher educational opportunities.
- Improve student's success in school to career transitions.
- Increase opportunities for vocational technical training.
- Utilize educational technology to enhance student learning.
