College units or Associate Degree and competency assessment may be required by some schools/districts

Note:

Required for K-8 Expanded Learning Programs May be required for 9-12 Expanded Learning Programs

Depending on the school/district, applications may be processed through Edjoin.org or directly through the school/district.

Community-based organizations/program providers (i.e. YMCA, Boys & Girls Club, etc), may handle the application process on behalf of the school/district.

> Certificate of Clearance or Fingerprinting may be required

Working in Expanded Learning is a way to start working in schools before completing a Bachelor's Degree and Teaching Credential Program.

Positions are often part time, making it easier to also attend classes and/or maintain other personal and family obligations.
