The McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act ensures educational rights and protections for children and youth experiencing homelessness.

In San Diego County there are an estimated 22,000 children enrolled in public schools who experience homelessness. The San Diego County Office of Education's Homeless Education Services Program provides support and resources to the 43 school districts and more than 100 Charter schools in the county, to serve their students experiencing homelessness.
