SELPA funding is withheld off the top of AB602 allocations for teh SELPA operations and administration, which is voted on /approved by our Governing Board. Remaining amounts withheld and not spent by year-end are returned to the Districts as a percent of their P2 ADA to the SELPA total.

Federal IDEA dollars are directly passed through to the districts. We distribute funds in the same manner in which they are earned.
