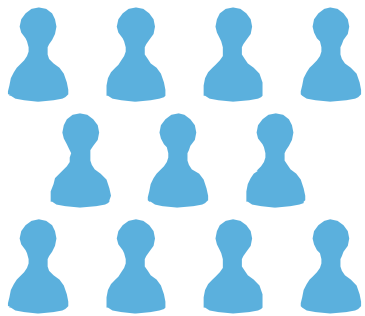
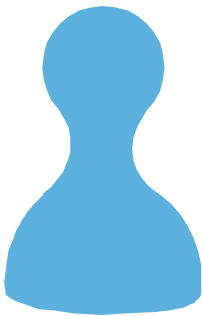

Assist potentially eligible callers with completing the CalFresh application. 211 may send an application packet to the caller to complete on his or her own or connect callers with a Community Based Organization (CBO) that may help with the application process, or provide the address of the nearest Family Resource Center (FRC) to apply in person.
